Pastor's Report

First, I want to say thank you to Trilbi who is my partner in life, and in ministry. Thanks for all you do for me, and for this church, I couldn't be successful without you.

Also, Thanks to such a most excellent Church Board, and awesome Ministry Team Leaders. What great teams we have.

Thank you to all who serve on any one of our **sixteen** Ministry teams. And thank you to all our amazing members, and everyone else who calls this church their home. You are all such a blessing and an encouragement. Thank you all for your service to the King, it is greatly appreciated, and will have eternal results.

This year I am going to base my report on Isaiah 43:18-19. This was the scripture that was placed on my heart when we were still in Alberta, but knowing we were moving here. It was inspired from God for the vision for this church, and a promise for new things. So, Isaiah 43:18-19 says: **“Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the desert and streams in the wasteland.”**

So, Forget the Former Things...

After we have reflected on them, then Praised God for them. Like last fiscal year's average church attendance of: 91. The year before was: 73. So that is an increase of: 24.8%. Praise God for what He is doing in and through this church. He is bringing people to our church as a result of His Holy Spirits presence which is apparent in and through all of our ministry teams; our services; Bible studies; prayer meetings; discipleship groups; which all add a whole new flavour to our potlucks dinners. God is doing a new thing, people are responding.

So, we can learn a lot by looking back, but not dwelling in the past or getting stuck there. That is the warning here. And, just like every other year, there are times of highs and lows; ups and downs; joy and sadness; and peace and unrest. But through all that, it was a time of personal, and corporate growth. A year of unity and not division; a year of personal learning and corporate learning; a year of searching for God and a year of finding God; a year of hearing from God and a year of submitting to God; a year of submitting to each other; and a year of understanding what it means to work together.

Now here is some really exciting news, for our new fiscal year: It is that the promise From God in Isaiah 43:18-19 is now being fulfilled, and lived out. Our role is to continually seek Him, and allow His will to unfold within our church. We focus on the promise that God is doing it. We just

have to seek Him, and follow along for the ride, and what a ride it promises to be. A ride of a way opening up in the desert, when there wasn't one before, and streams forming in the wastelands, signifying new life. So, the focus in this report is on the promise of the **new thing** that is now springing up.

Do Not Dwell On the Past...

A part of the vision I have received was for our church to enter into a personal relationship with Jesus like we have never known or experienced before. That challenge is for everyone in this church who calls themselves Christian. Because, the new thing God is doing is this: He is bringing His people into a deeper and deeper relationship with Jesus. He is drawing us to Him. God has revealed to me the need for Christians everywhere to reach new levels of discipleship. In order to accomplish that, we must commit ourselves to **spreading the gospel**. We must become more and more like the early disciples of Jesus, if we are to be effective today. They gave everything for the cause of Christ.

See I Am Doing a New Thing...

There are so many new things happening in and through this church. Just look at the amount of Bible Studies and prayer groups that are happening. And we keep adding new groups, from Bible Studies, to Prayer, to Discipleship groups. God is speaking to His people, and His people are responding in obedience, and speaking Jesus.

Because, Now it Springs Up...

And we already know that being a true disciple of Jesus requires an all or nothing, no holds barred, type of an attitude. With Jesus it is all or nothing. There is no middle of the road. We in the church have only tried to create one. You see, it doesn't really exist, and there is no such thing as complacent discipleship according to Jesus.

When we hold out on God, we die.

I don't mean physically, but a piece of us dies spiritually, and over a period of time, we die a slow, painful, spiritual death. You still not convinced? You still think you can serve Jesus half-heartedly? Listen to this verse, where Jesus is speaking, He said: "I know your deeds, that you are neither cold nor hot. I wish you were either one or the other! So because you are lukewarm – neither cold nor hot – I am about to spit you out of my mouth." **Revelation 3:16**

So, There you have it, there is no in between. You are either following Jesus with everything, or nothing.

Warning:

If you think you are in the middle, then you are really on the way to spiritual death.

I don't say this to condemn, but to get you to examine yourselves, and realize that God wants all of you, not just the parts that you want to give, or the areas that you can give over without much thought, or without any suffering.

Jesus wants us to deny ourselves, to take up our crosses and to follow Him. There is no in between.

Do You Not Perceive It...

People are being deceived today; left, right, and center. So, it is a great time to be a disciple of Jesus so we can help people figure things out. Politicians will never figure things out. People will always be left or right in regard to politics. And with Jesus, there is no left or right, there is only **up or down**.

So, it is up to us Christians to help other Christians, and non-Christians, to be or become disciples of Jesus. God is creating our future as I am speaking right now. He is partially creating it based on our reactions, and our responses to this Pastor's Report.

How are you going to respond?

I say let's follow the Way.

A Way in the Desert...

That is the vision that God is giving me for this church.

To go deeper, and to press on. To be a genuine disciple of Jesus and to ask all the tough questions, no matter the personal cost.

So there it is. Vision!

And with any God given vision, there has to be a way of implementation to carry it out.

And that is where our team ministries come in. We grow smaller to get bigger. That is our principle for church. And the ministries themselves come as a direct result of people being drawn by the Holy Spirit to be involved. And, These ministries **will** result in much fruit, because they are inspired by the Holy Spirit.

So just think about this: Any ministry from now on, will be a direct result of people's deep commitment to follow Christ. Now that is very exciting! These are indeed exciting times to be a follower of Jesus.

Streams in the Wasteland...

I believe God will do so much more in this next fiscal year. The streams will flow into the ocean creating more and more opportunities for church growth, both numeric, and in the deepening of our faith. God promises us in His Word that He will do so much more than we could ever ask or imagine. In fact, He says He will do immeasurably more. Ephesians chapter 3, verse 20 is the great promise that God **will** do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to His power that is at work within us. As a result, we need to be praising Him and giving Him all the glory about what is going on in and through this church.

Because, when a church is living in the Jesus flow, Immeasurably more flows out.

Because, when God says it, God does it.

I am happy to say that this vision that God has given me, to live out Holiness in our church, is happening. We are Living out our passion for Jesus.

It is now Time to Continually Go Deeper and to Press on...

God is doing a new thing. We need to embrace that new thing, we need to seek the deeper levels of discipleship, and we need to work together to win the battle against the subtleties of evil in this pagan society we are living in today. A society that needs to know Jesus.

That is our challenge. That is our goal. It sounds like an overwhelming, impossible challenge, because the subtleties and deceptions of evil today seem so powerful, and at times seem to be impossible to overcome.

But, The Greatest News of All Time...

The war has already been won, and victory is ours. That victory in Jesus. We still need to fight some battles, but the war has been won. What a great way to look at it. Sure we are involved in a battle, but we know the outcome. That should empower us to be more and more confident in and through our battles because that confidence gives us the boldness that will make a real difference to the people all around us. People will benefit from that boldness in our faith.

People's lives will be changed because of Jesus.

Now, since we do have that knowledge, and since we do know the outcome, it is time.

It is time to go deeper, to continually press on, and to make sure our church becomes that colony of heaven in a hostile world, just as it was intended to be. It is time for us to enter into this **new** phase with a **new** boldness, and a real sense of mission. It is time to become the disciples that we were created to become. It is time to have attitudes like the disciples did in the

book of Acts, who thought it was an honour when they got beaten for the sake of Christ. The time is now to approach the battle with intensity, with vision, with a new set of goals, and with a new sense of confidence, knowing that the war has already been won, because Christ has guaranteed the victory!

The Challenge, Theme, and Promise...

The **challenge** is to Go Deep, the **theme** is boldness in Jesus, and the **promise** is from Isaiah 43:18-19. **“Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the desert and streams in the wasteland.”**

The Church Board meets monthly and discusses a myriad of different topics, ranging from the oversight of various church ministries to the overall administration of our home church. Once again, heartfelt thanks to members of the Church Board for your steadfast service, dedication, and commitment to the Summerside Church of the Nazarene and ongoing support in my role as Church Board Secretary; it is greatly appreciated! In her second year as our Church Administrative Assistant, Trilbi's organizational skills and attention to detail help to keep this church running smoothly. Trilbi's unwavering faith, her love for and support of Pastor Trevor, and unconditional love for her church family is inspirational. Her empathetic and loving spirit is felt by all of us. The time and love she pours into our church does not go unnoticed, not only in her role as Administrative Assistant, but also her involvement in many of our church ministries, including Women's Ministry, Youth Ministry, Compassion and Care Ministry Team, Worship Team, Children's Ministry and Prime Time. We are now in our fourth year since Pastor Trevor accepted the role as Shepherd in our home church. We are truly blessed to have a Pastor who is a man of prayer, consistently preaches the inerrant Word of God, has the heart of a servant and is filled with the Holy Spirit. It is comforting to have a Pastor who every morning walks through the church sanctuary praying over every seat! The time, effort and prayer spent preparing his sermons is much appreciated. Our current church membership stands at 92, with 20 people joining our church family over the course of the last year. Several members of our church family also experienced profound challenges, whether these involved physical, mental, or spiritual health related concerns. However, Holy Scripture reminds us of God's promise, in John 16:33, where it says, *“I have said these things to you so that in Me you may have peace. I have conquered the world.”* As a brand-new fiscal church year begins to unfold, your Church Board looks forward to what our Lord & Savior, Jesus Christ, has in store for us and our home church. Children's Ministry Team (CMT)

Matthew 19:14 reads: "But Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and don't stop them! God's kingdom is made up of people like these."

This past Fall we started on a new journey with the Jr. Church Ministry. When I began as coordinator, I knew that I would have to work in small steps to reach our big goals which would hopefully build on the already strong foundation created by leaders before me. Our major goals for the Fall and Winter included recruiting more teachers, recruiting more helpers, implementing a new curriculum that would make teaching more streamlined and engage our kids well, and creating a schedule that would empower our volunteers to serve long-term without burn-out. These steps would hopefully lead to a strong, consistent set of volunteers ready to serve and love our kids, lead our children into being engaged and excited to come each week, and to see more and more kids come out to spend time together and learn about God. I am so grateful and thankful to say that we have made great strides towards all of these goals. Here are just a few highlights:

- In spring of 2024, we ended the season with approximately four teachers and five helpers. At this point (April 2025) we now have eight teachers and eight helpers (we still have room for a couple more people in each volunteer stream to truly fill a strong two month schedule with breathing room).
- We started with a new curriculum called Eureka! - an engaging curriculum that not only engages the kids in discovery-based learning where they come to their own take-aways from the scripture and activities (lovingly guided by the leaders and helpers) but also is designed with a very efficient, consistent and smooth routine that empowers teachers in their confidence the more lessons they teach as they know what to expect each week and get accustomed to the lesson steps. Students receive a beautiful Discovery Guide each week with scriptures, photos, activities, and more that they take home and can use to recall the lesson highlights and continue the fun.
- Our schedule is now built so that each teacher and helper serves once every two months. This allows our volunteers to follow their hearts in other ministries as well if they choose, and hopefully be able to better balance their volunteer responsibilities so that they continue to love what they do with a happy heart. We maintain this schedule currently by offering clipboards for the children upstairs in the sanctuary during the service on any weeks where we do not have a teacher to fill the slot - in order to stay true to our "once every two months" routine. We hope to gain one or two more teachers and helpers to alleviate these blank weeks in the coming months.
- My guiding verse and my vision as a leader as I stepped into this role is definitely inspired by Colossians 3:23-24: "Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving." My heart for this ministry was to follow the Lord's leading in building more strength, efficiency, effectiveness, and love into the week by week routines of the ministry and over time to see growth in volunteer numbers, volunteer commitment and love for the ministry, and an increase in numbers and consistency in children's attendance. I knew this labor of love would need to be in baby

steps, working one detail at a time, doing each small thing WELL before moving on and growing bigger. I believe this lines up with the above verse - working "heartily" and "as for the Lord" at each step, each area of growth, each improvement. Over time, our small baby steps will actually seem like big strides - and all for the glory of the Lord and for the love of serving our littles!

Compassion & Care Ministry Team (CCMT)

The Compassion & Care Ministry Team (CCMT) is led by Pastor Trevor. The mission of the CCMT is to provide compassion and care to our church family and community. The CCMT consists of two sub teams which sometimes overlap: Church Family led by Trilbi Feltham and Community led by Judy MacDougall. Team members include Victoria Kingyens, Liz DesRoches, and Kathy Bobar.

The CCMT relies heavily on help from our church family, and we are thankful we have a church family who is compassionate and caring.

The Church Family sub team's main focal areas are: 1) Visitation - visiting new families, people in crisis, shut-ins, seniors in long term care, sick, bereaved, and wherever there is a need. Although Pastor Trevor visits new families and people in crisis or need, he appreciates the help and support from his church family. Thank you to Victoria Kingyens for coordinating visitation schedules for shut-ins, seniors in long term care, and other needs as they arise. 2) Food Delivery – preparing and delivering food to the sick, bereaved, etc. Thank you to Kathy Bobar for coordinating this initiative. 3) Cards – thank you to Liz DesRoches who faithfully sends sympathy, get well, or thinking of you cards on behalf of our church to our church family or to those connected to our church family.

Highlights from the Community sub team include the following: A Christmas gift card tree raised over 500 dollars' worth of gift cards for people in need, both within our church family and community not only at Christmas time but all year round. An appeal in the spring resulted in a generous donation of Tim Horton and McDonald's gift cards. Gas cards were also purchased for those who were required to travel for medical needs or other reasons. As our church was seeing more unhoused people at our doors, especially during the summer months, an appeal was made to our church family to donate 'grab and go' food items – the response was again phenomenal! Items such as socks and hygiene supplies were also donated. Blessings bags were filled a few times over this fiscal year which were used to not only fill our food cupboard, but excess food was also given to the Salvation Army and Community Fridge. Over the winter months, a container was placed in the church foyer for food donations to ensure our food cupboard remained well stocked. On December 15th a Church Family and Friends Christmas turkey dinner not only provided an opportunity for our church family to fellowship together but also served as an outreach to the community with over a 100 people in attendance; following dinner everyone enjoyed a beautiful time of singing Christmas carols.

A new initiative this fiscal year was 'Pizza with the Pastor' which provided an opportunity for new people within our church family to share lunch with Pastor Trevor, Trilbi, and representatives from the Church Board. This event occurred on October 20th following the morning service and was a wonderful time of fellowship.

Thank you again for being such compassionate, generous, and caring people!

Share Word Global Initiative:

- Ongoing partnership has significantly boosted evangelism efforts.
- Over 150 Bibles and gospel booklets distributed within the community.
- Led to meaningful conversations about faith.
- Contributed to an increase in church attendance by new members.
- Strengthened the congregation's commitment to evangelism.
- New partnership established with the Mission Thrift Store on Greenwood Dr for free distribution of Bibles and magazines.

Training Initiatives:

- **Ignite and Go Training (Completed in 2023):**
 - Several members participated in practical evangelism skills training.
 - Focused on effective communication, cultural context understanding, and personal testimony sharing.

 - Exploration of Ray Comfort's training to provide a critical look at modern gospel messages.
 - Emphasis on presenting the full counsel of God, including trials, temptation, and persecution.
 - Aims to equip evangelists with a more comprehensive and realistic message of the Christian faith.
 - Goal to establish a training session in late Spring 2025.
- **Overall Impact:**
 - The combined impact of Share Word Global and training initiatives has been transformative for the church.
 - The congregation is becoming better equipped for meaningful evangelism.
 - Efforts are focused on presenting a gospel that is both hopeful and honest.
 - Continuing to see fruits in individuals coming to faith and growing in their relationship with Christ.

 - Remain steadfast in the mission to spread the gospel.

Griefshare

Griefshare is a support group that offers a safe, welcoming place where people understand the difficult emotions of grief. This 13 week program, helps people to discover what to expect in the days ahead and what is “normal” in grief. Since there are no neat, orderly stages of grief, people learn helpful ways of coping with grief, in all its unpredictability .

Each week the Griefshare group begins with a 30 minute video featuring respected experts on grief related topics and helpful stories from people who have experienced the loss of a loved one. Their insights can help people manage their emotions, gain clarity, and find answers thru the grief process.

After the video, group members spend time discussing what was presented and what is going on in their lives. Talking with other people helps bring comfort, normalize the grief experience and offers a supportive environment to work thru their grief.

People that face loss and grief will experience many of the same challenges. The weekly Griefshare topics address these common struggles such as: loneliness, fear, anger, regrets, relationships, hope, and much more.

Griefshare provides valuable tips, encouragement and direction through the grief journey.

We held our first Griefshare session from Sept. - Dec. 2024.
The next group is planned for the summer of 2025.

Men's Ministry Team (MMT)

Thank you to the other members of the Men's Ministry Team (MMT) for their faithful service (Pastor Trevor, Mark Flawn, Dean Macdonald, and Clayton Smith). Throughout the 2024-2025 church fiscal year, the Men's Ministry continued to seek Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, by emphasizing prayer, studying God's Word, sharing our own walk of faith, and being mindful of what Jesus said to His disciples in Matthew 16:24, "whoever wants to be My disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow Me."

The two main branches/groups comprising the MMT - Men's Breakfast (taking place the 1st Saturday of each month and commencing at 8:30 a.m.) and Men's Bible Study (taking place weekly on Tuesdays commencing at 7:00 p.m.). The Biblical focus of the Men's Breakfast for the better part of this past year has been the Gospel of John, with an average monthly attendance of 15 men. In Holy Scripture, food is considered a gift from God, symbolizing both physical and spiritual nourishment, and is used to foster fellowship and strengthen our relationship with Jesus Christ and with each other. The Men's Tuesday evening Bible Study, under the capable leadership of Clayton Smith, continues to bring an average of 12-15 men together to study God's Word, with its current emphasis on the Book of Galatians, and, in turn, apply it to our daily lives. The MMT has decided to expand the weekly Study into two (2) groups, one (1) group constituting a facilitation type style of study, wherein the Word of God is shared, and group members engage in a reciprocal form of learning; whereas, the second group will involve a more traditional teacher-student style, a study penetrating deep into the Word and involving the 'teacher' taking the lead role. This expansion will take place, on a trial basis, commencing in the Spring 2025.

The third branch (Special Events) encompassed several different activities throughout the church year, including three (3) members from our home church (Ron Geary, Mark Flawn, and me) attending Big Lake Camp in Nova Scotia between June 21st - June 23rd; the Women Appreciation Dinner on November 3rd, with its theme "You are Beautiful" and 34 women in attendance; and most recently, February 4th, when 15 men gathered together at our home church to share pizza, and actively engage in Christian fellowship.

The foundational building block of the MMT, by way of its three (3) branches, remains the same, that being to edify each other, as men; glorify God through the reading of His inerrant Word; living out our daily lives according to His will; and prayer, these same components captured

beautifully by 20th Century American missionary, Jim Elliot, who, along with four (4) others, was martyred in a small village in Ecuador on January 8, 1956, while the 28 year-old was bringing villagers the Gospel message, “Lord, make me a crisis man. Let me not be a milepost on a single road but make me a fork that men must turn one way or another in facing Christ in me.

Nazarene Missions International (NMI) is an organization for mobilizing the local church in the Church of the Nazarene. Thank you church family for electing me as your local NMI president and the privilege of being your representative at the Atlantic District Assembly at Oxford Church on May 30, 31 and June 1, 2024. Your prayers, support, and participation in the NMI ministry is greatly appreciated as this Ministry is vital in the life of the church. I attended an NMI Zoom meeting on February 24, 2025, for all the local NMI presidents from the Atlantic District. The Zoom meeting was initiated by newly appointed Pastor Annabella Vasquez San Jose, NMI District President, Elsy Marino Guerra, Vice President, Paula Rideout and Charlene Campbell. These meetings will be held periodically to ensure support and information sharing for the local NMI presidents.

The NMI mission is to make Christ-like disciples in the Nation.

This mission is supported by the core values of a Christian People, a Holiness People, and a Missional People. The NMI vision is to realize personal and corporate Wesleyan holiness revival resulting in the growth and proliferation of churches where disciples are making disciples in Africa and around the world.

NMI focuses on five (5) areas of impact: 1) Prayer, encouraging people to pray for all efforts of world evangelism. March 2-8, 2025, was designated as the NMI Global Week of Prayer. Thank you for being a praying church. 2) World Evangelism Fund (WEF) which was created to allow missionaries to work more effectively and encourage all churches to support missions by allocating 5.5% of their local church income. It was collected through our Thanksgiving and Easter offerings, as well as Faith Promise. Faith Promise is a promise made in faith between an individual and God and is given beyond one's tithe. A Faith Promise Sunday was held on October 6, 2024. Thank you to those who joyfully give to the WEF. 3) Alabaster Offering which was promoted in September and February; a total of \$625.08 was raised this fiscal year. Alabaster funds help provide land for many Work & Witness projects and the entire Alabaster offering goes toward the purchase of land and construction of churches, schools, medical facilities, and homes for missionaries and national workers. Thank you for supporting Alabaster, every penny counts! 4) Engaging Children and Youth in all missions' endeavors and nurturing them as they seek to respond to God's call. Our Junior Church children participated in a bimonthly mission lesson and mission books were available for our children and youth. Thank you for nurturing and praying for our children and youth. 5) LINKS, which is a network of personal connections between missionaries and Nazarene districts around the world. Our Canada Atlantic District Links missionaries are Roger and Damaris Kellogg, who are currently serving in Guatemala, Honduras, and El Salvador. Please keep them in your prayers. NMI promotes a Calendar of Emphases to assist in mobilizing the Church of the Nazarene in missions; the varying NMI emphases are highlighted monthly in the Missions Corner in our church bulletin. Again, please pray for all these emphases.

Thank you to all who participated in Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child, 38 boxes were delivered from our home church on November 21, 2024. It is at this point in my Report that I usually talk about local missions, however, local missions' initiatives, such as the blessing bags, food cupboard, gift cards, etc. have been moved to our Compassion and Care Ministry Team. As a result, NMI's focus in our home church is primarily on global missions.

Year-in-Review

Bible Questions Tool (Google Form) - In last year's report, we introduced a tool enabling individuals to submit questions related to difficult or less clear Bible passages. This form remains active, promoted on the pre-service slides and available on the church website under the *Teaching Ministry Team* section. It continues to assist believers in rightly handling the Word of Truth.

Theology Talk – 2024-25 was a big year for Theology Talks with 9 sessions completed on the following topics:

- Biblical Inerrancy
- The Communicable Attributes of God
- The Incommunicable Attributes of God
- The Trinity
- Who is Jesus? – Honours that prove He is God
- Who is Jesus? – Attributes that prove He is God
